## SCHOOL FACTS

Millbrook Senior High, grades 9-12, is a public secondary school with a total enrollment of 2,400 students. Located in the northern suburbs of the state capital of North Carolina, Millbrook is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. There are 145 members of the faculty with a support staff of 12 secretaries, guidance and media technicians.

Advanced Placement and honors courses are offered in the areas of English, mathematics, science, social studies, foreign language, and the arts. The Paideia studies program in humanities helps develop reasoning and thinking skills. Paideia is a pairing of courses in English and social studies/philosophy. Millbrook cooperates with local universities and technical colleges to provide dual enrollment opportunities for selected courses.

The Career and Technical Education Department offers course work in the following areas: agriculture, business, commercial art, drafting, engineering, foods, and public services.

Special programs are available for exceptional students who meet state guidelines.

Millbrook is a 4-A high school governed by the North Carolina Athletic Association. The Wildcats compete in football, basketball, baseball, softball, soccer, track, cross country, golf, swimming, volleyball, wrestling, tennis and gymnastics and are recognized statewide for athletic excellence.
